You can enjoy these full-length titles while you walk, drive, move around the house or just relax. Use your own earphones or buy a pair at the Circulation Desk for \$1. The library supplies the single AAA battery needed. Instructions are simple, and controls allow users to pause and resume listening anywhere on the recording. Authors now available include Elizabeth Berg, Harlan Coben, Michael Connelly, Tony Hillerman, Mark Twain, Anne Tyler and many others. In addition to popular fiction, we offer non-fiction titles as well as a variety of foreign language instruction including French, Spanish, Portuguese, Chinese, Japanese, Italian, Greek and Modern Hebrew.
